In 2006 the Faculty of Economics, Moscow State University of M. Lomonosov, published a collective monograph “Business Environment in New EU Member States”, which contains scientific works of Lithuanian and Czech researchers. The monograph consists of two volumes: “Business Environment in Lithuania” and “Business Environment in the Czech Republic”.

The aim of the monograph is to analyse tendencies of the uprise of the support for small and middle sized business, its legal regulation and development in Lithuania and the Czech Republic while their integration into the EU as well as to highlight basic challenges of the integration into the EU for business in new EU member states.

The *first volume* of the monograph pays essential attention to the analysis of small and middle business development possibilities in Lithuania the development of small and middle business stimulation tools and the increase of their efficiency as well as the process of enterprise internalisation strategy creation during Lithuania’s integration into the EU. Main aspects of Lithuanian economic policy, foreign trade, the influence of energy and climate change policy upon business development as well as business macroeconomic environment are also studied. The *second volume* analyses macroeconomic influences of globalisation upon Czech economy, as well as new tendencies of the support for small and middle business management and its internationalisation processes.

The most important issues discussed in the collective monograph written by more than 20 Lithuanian and Czech scientists are related with promotion of small and medium business and emphasizes the social and economic impact of SMEs in transition economies. The monograph presents the valuable input into economic and management research and enhance cooperation and experience sharing between economies in transition.
